Division of syllabi into modules, student subject aptitude test, apprising of programme outcomes(POs) and curse outcomes(COs) Power point presentation, continuous internal evaluation, supplying study materials etc.
- 2. **Internal personal relationship-**There is good relation among the staff and between students and staff. There is no and day loss due to any agitation or students movement. On a regular basis department wise PTM is also held.
- 3. **Clean and Green campus-**This has been looked into very seriously. In the college there is more than 1 acre green belt and a peaceful ambience.
- 4. **Skill Development Programmes-** In the college there are many running Add-on courses, like Communicative English, Basic Computer Literacy Programme and Job oriented courses.
- 5. **Hostel and canteen facility-** 30 beds hostel is going to be inaugurated and there is sophisticated canteen.
- 6. Surveillance- Almost entire campus is well secured with nearly 40+ CC TV
- 7. Digital communication- Wide circulation of any information regarding teaching, learning, administration is done through website, college Apps, whatsapp, Zoom etc.
- 8. **Strong precautionary measures-** In respect of Ragging, harassments, discriminatory act there are separate committee/squad for constant vigil. This campus has made a ragging free campus.
- 9. **Eco friendly campus-** Eco-friendly initiatives like-solar panel, waste management, plastic free & lush green campus, water recharging, etc. have been undertaken
- 10. **Democratic management-** In all respect a collective decision is resolved through designated committee/sub-committee. There are all mandatory such committees/sub committees where individual's opinion is priced.

Institutional Weakness

INSTITUTIONAL WEAKNESS:

A weakness is a factor requiring improvement internally. These factors create some disadvantages to take the

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advantages of opportunity.

- 1. **Space Crunch-** Space crunch stands on the way of future expansion of the college.
- 2. **Lack of Research facility-** As in the UG college there is main focus in teaching-learning and thereby there is least opportunity in research.
- 3. **Absence of industry-** institute linkages- Due to location it is lacked of industry-linkage and collaboration and resultant absence of campus placement.
- 4. **Dropout rates-** As the most of the students are first generation learners and due to the low level of understanding of their parents on higher education, many bright students even left the track of their study. Besides, their family's insolvency is also one of the causes of dropout.

Institutional Opportunity

INSTITUTIONAL OPPORTUNITY:

- 1. **Need based course-** There is ample opportunity for agro based courses, UG course in Physical education, Job oriented diploma courses etc. All these are for employment generation.
- 2. **Infrastructural facility-** As such present non human infrastructure is somehow manageable but in opening up of PG course and other diploma course appointment of qualified human resource as well as enhancement non human infrastructure have to be addressed.
- 3. **Linkages between industry-** institution-In running the existing UG course or after completion of such courses there should have opportunity for the students to pursue various job seeking opportunity and that are to be conducted by the industry at their need.

Institutional Challenge

INSTITUTIONAL CHALLENGE:

These are such factors that institution face difficulties to implement the scopes of opportunity.

- 1. **NAAC-** In absence of NAAC accreditation the college authority is not in a position to apply for affiliation of Post-Graduation Courses.
- 2. **Absence of Government grants in conduction seminar, research etc.-** There is prominent that non availability of Government grant in supporting major/minor research and even conducting national/international seminar.
- 3. **Institution-industry collaboration/linkages-** Although it is very necessary but it is absent due to its location. This is major challenge of the college.
- 4. **MOU** with renowned institution- As this is rural and remote college and striving to disseminate higher education among the local needy people who do not have broad outlook and thereby MOU with renowned institution is near to impossible.

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- 5. Conducting interdisciplinary/multi-disciplinary UG programmes to be abridged between core course and discipline.
- 6. Local people awareness and financial strength- These two issues are very vital in prospering higher education. In respect of the college lacked awareness in higher education of the families (from where students come) and their financial weaknesses have major negative impact in the progress of higher education as a whole.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

CRITERION-1-CURRICULAR ASPECTS:

SAVPMs Sancheti College of Arts, Commerce and Science has a clear vision and mission to fulfill the needs of the students of Pune in Education.

Curricular planning is the mainstay of any higher educational institution. Being an affiliated undergraduate college, our institution depends, on a large extent. On the curricular framework and guidelines provided by the parent university. The academic programs are delivered as per the curriculum of the affiliating university which has been formulated to satisfy the rapidly changing academia's growing challenges. The responsibility of the institution lies in academic planning and implementation of the curriculum by adhering to a flexible academic calendar and arranging and documenting the process of continuous internal assessment of students.

The **SAVPMs Sancheti College of Arts, Commerce and Science** aims at imparting higher education to the poor, socially and economically backward sections. The HEI has played a significant role in students' overall development in terms of knowledge, skills, and values.

The new CBCS curriculum introduced by the university is successfully adopted by our College from 2019-20 session. Apart from issues of flexibility and diversity, the college collects the feedback on various curricular aspects from different stakeholders such as the students, alumni and faculty using structured format. Stakeholders' expectations as coded in their feedback is an important input for initiation and sustenance of quality initiatives in the institution.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

CRITERION-2-TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION

- 1. In regard to enrolment of students, the rate of enrolment of students in 2018-19 was 17% only, which changed to more than 30% in 2022-23, which is encouraging in last five years for the college. Further currently in the AY 2023-24, the figures touched 81% in the enrolment percentage.
- 2. Regarding students' teacher ratio the institution is having necessary ratio of 15:1 between students and the teachers as to accomplish teaching learning activates properly.
- 3. In connection with teaching learning process the Institution has adopted student's centric methods as holistic approach for providing necessary knowledge and skills to the students. In this connection effective Learning Management System have been implemented synchronizing theory and practical programmes. The Institution is having well organized ICT system for effective teaching learning

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process.

- 4. Faculties of the Institution have attained stipulated academic criteria as being enshrined by UGC and constantly cultivating their academic profile for consistent amelioration.
- 5. The evaluation process and its reforms the CBCS has been adopted by the affiliating university and accordingly the Institution has been adopted CBCS for both curriculum and examination system. Continuous evaluation systems of both formative and summative in nature have been adopted in a regular manner to assess the academic progress of students in different discipline. The faculty members of the Institutions are actively engaged in all patterns of examination system.
- 6. In relation to students' performance and learning outcome the affiliating University, each department in our college organises introductory interface session with Students in regard to programme outcomes and course outcomes. Accordingly the Institution maintains its website to display POs COs in each Course curriculum and activities.

Research, Innovations and Extension

CRITERION-3- RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS AND EXTENSION

Faculty members are encouraged to take up major & minor research project and funding through government & non-government agencies. Current Principal of the college along with few colleagues and faculty members have applied to various DST schemes for funded projects.

Facuty members are encouraged to go for various On-line / Off-line professional courses like Orientation, refresher, short-term and faculty development programmes both within the states and out station also. There has been limited, good quality Research Publications by few staff & faculty members in Peer-reviewed, UGC-CARE, SCOPUS journals. The current Principal of the college has authored & published various Books and written chapters in other ISBN published Books.

We have an evergreen campus with open space and ground. Planting of saplings is done on a regular basis by the students on World Earth Day & World Environment Day. Reduce, Reuse & Recycle have also been incorporated. Extension activities are a must for developing sensitivities' towards community issues, Gender disparities social-in-justice. Activities are done on these areas through Seminar & Webinar Extension & Outreach Programmes are performed through various cells functional within the campus. Thus bonding with the society is created through literacy campaign, medical screening awareness programme, Awareness Programme, Medical Programme, various Birth and Death Anniversery celebrations, working with a mission like "ME & YOU - BOTH TOGETHER" with the purpose of help serve, reflect and learn.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

CRITERION-4- INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The College has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching and learning. The college has twelve classrooms, 3 portable projectors, six smart classrooms, two computer laboratories, one auditorium / hall with portable PA system, Library, Princicpal's cabin, Admin office with computers, Exam section with computer and Printer / copier, independent departmental workstations, and one teachers' staff room. The college auditorium / hall was created in the year 2022. It has a sitting capacity of 100+ audiences. The institution has a common room for both male and female students to organize and practice indoor games. All types of outdoor games are

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facilitated by the staff using the open ground.

The IT infrastructure of the college is also adequate. The college has 50+ computers (Desktops & Laptops), 6 Printers, 2 Scanners, and 3 Projectors. Out of these most of the Desktops & few Laptops are for academic purposes. There are two browsing centres in the institution.

The management spends a substantial amount of the revenue in development & augmentation of infrastructure.

Student Support and Progression

The institution provides necessary assistance to students to acquire meaningful experiences for learning thus leading to holistic development and progression. Students of the College receive several grants from various schemes under the Government of Maharashtra granting financial support to meritorious students belonging to economically backward families.

It receives some endowments from trustees and philanthropists which are awarded to meritorious students every year. The institution offers several add-on courses certified by the college itself.

The college conducts on-campus drive through placement cell every year. The institution takes special efforts to improve student performance and large number of students have progressed to higher education and gainful employment. Alumni association has introduced various programes to impart skill training to students. It gives all-around support for the proper functioning of the College.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

The Vision of National Education Policy is to
provide high quality education to develop human
resources in our nation. In view of the NEP, our
affiliating university (SPPU) have implemented the

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Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for all programs. Our college is affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU), Pune. Hence the college doesn't have academic autonomy to design the curriculum. The college is planning to introduce interdisciplinary certificate courses to benefit students. The university to which our college is affiliated has already taken steps to move towards Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary approach by revising the curriculum of UG programmes in 2024. In order to provide holistic academic growth among students, an Interdisciplinary curriculum has been proposed which gives freedom to the student to choose their preferred options from the range of programs offered by the college. 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC): Sancheti College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Thergaon is affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University Pune. The college implements the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) based on the guidelines of the affiliating university. Our affiliating university has introduced a choice-based credit system (CBCS) in all programs from 2019. In CBCS, students have to acquire 8 credits in addition to the compulsory credits from core courses offered by the university. The college has appointed few subject teachers to take care of these additional credits collected by the students. The students are encouraged to earn additional credits from various websites and platforms. The credits earned by the students are then verified and submitted to the University through an internal mark's entry portal by respective teachers. 3. Skill development: The focus of the college is on promoting Value-Based Quality Education; hence the college takes efforts to inculcate positivity among the students by introducing Add-on courses related to the skills development. Our college provides value-based education to instill an optimistic approach to students through organizing programs such as Human Rights Day, Voter Awareness Program, Environment Issues, Gender Sensitization and Yoga. The college is going to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with industries for practical knowledge and development of industry required skills. 4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge India is one of the most multilingual and system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using multicultural countries in the world and the varied

online course):	languages and cultures are our heritage and legacy to pass on to the next generations. Regarding the adoption of Indian languages, the college offers various Indian languages like Marathi, English and Hindi as subjects in degree courses. The college also celebrates all cultural programmes, events, ceremonies, days and festivals to inculcate the moral and social values in students.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	The College makes an effort to understand that a pursuit of knowledge is a life-long activity and to acquire a positive attitude and other qualities which will lead students to a successful life. Our college uses the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) System in accordance with Savitribai Phule Pune University's guidelines. The college intends to standardize and promote the OBE system in such a way that students will be able to acquire new abilities that are necessary for compliance with global norms. To interpret, analyse, evaluate and develop responsibility and effective citizenship is one of the programme outcomes of the students.
6. Distance education/online education:	Online education has connected students and resources of the different regions under one umbrella. Faculties are using online mode for teaching like Google meet, Zoom etc. Also, Google form is used for Evaluation of internal assessment as well as collecting feedback. The college Campus is Wi-Fi enabled and the college has successfully imparted all course content delivery in online mode during Pandemic period and examinations have been also conducted in online mode. These are some of the institutional efforts towards blended learning.
